on the beach is a 1957 post apocalyptic novel written by british australian author nevil shute after he emigrated to australia the novel details the experiences of a mixed group of people in melbourne as they await the arrival of deadly radiation spreading towards them from the northern hemisphere following a nuclear war a year previously as the radiation approaches each person deals with their impending death in different ways

this book describes the entire coast and beaches and barrier systems of australia it covers the coastal processes and systems that form and impact australia s 30 000 km coast 12 000 beaches and 2750 barrier systems these processes include geology geomorphology climate waves tides currents sediment supply as well as coastal ecosystems the coast is divided into tropical northern and southern temperate provinces within which are seven divisions 23 regions and 354 coastal sediment compartments each of which is described in detail in the 34 chapters within these systems are the full range of wave through tide dominated beaches and barriers ranging from cheniers to massive transgressive dune systems together with a range of onshore and longshore sand transport systems this is an up to date reference for the entire coast its present condition and likely responses to the impacts of climate change

the coast is one of our most valuable assets but how is it being treated and what is being done to look after it coastal management in australia is the first book to provide a comprehensive overview of this important subject interesting case studies are used to illustrate human impact on coastal processes as well as demonstrating the global significance of the coast and the international imperative to manage it properly coastal management in australia introduces the background to the various coastal management systems operating in australia and illustrates these with real world examples from the different states and territories since this book was first published yet another parliamentary inquiry has been added to some 30 years of national inquiries into coastal management with further calls for national co ordination in addition the australian government has focused

attention on the potential risks of climate change for the australian coast both authors have national and international coastal expertise significant academic teaching experience in coastal processes and coastal management coastal planning and policy skills and have extensive government expertise in coastal management

this open access volume provides for the first time a comprehensive description and scientific evaluation of underwater archaeological finds referring to human occupation of the continental shelf around the coastlines of europe and the mediterranean when sea levels were lower than present these are the largest body of underwater finds worldwide amounting to over 2500 find spots ranging from individual stone tools to underwater villages with unique conditions of preservation the material reviewed here ranges in date from the lower palaeolithic period to the bronze age and covers 20 countries bordering all the major marine basins from the atlantic coasts of ireland and norway to the black sea and from the western baltic to the eastern mediterranean the finds from each country are presented in their archaeological context with information on the history of discovery conditions of preservation and visibility their relationship to regional changes in sea level and coastal geomorphology and the institutional arrangements for their investigation and protection editorial introductions summarise the findings from each of the major marine basins there is also a final section with extensive discussion of the historical background and the legal and regulatory frameworks that inform the management of the underwater cultural heritage and collaboration between offshore industries archaeologists and government agencies the volume is based on the work of cost action td0902 splashcos a multi disciplinary and multi national research network supported by the eu funded cost organisation european cooperation in science and technology the primary readership is research and professional archaeologists marine and quaternary scientists cultural heritage managers commercial and governmental organisations policy makers and all those with an interest in the sea floor of the continental shelf and the human impact of changes in climate sea level and coastal geomorphology

geologically the south australian coast is very young having evolved over only 1 of geological time during the past 43 million years since the separation of australia and antarctica it is also very dynamic with the current shoreline position having been established from only 7000 years ago the south australian mainland coast is 3816 km long with islands providing an additional 1251 km of coast giving a total coastline of just over 5000 km south australian coastal landforms include cliffs rocky outcrops and shore platforms mangrove woodlands mudflats estuaries extensive sandy beaches coastal dunes and coastal barrier systems as well as numerous near shore reefs and islands this book is a landmark study into the variable character of the south australian coast and its long term evolution

this is a longitudinal study of the reclamation of the kaurna language where kaurna people are working in collaboration with linguists and educators the book takes an ecological perspective to trace the history of kaurna drawing on all known sources and emerging uses in the modern period

the natural resources of new guinea and nearby islands have attracted outsiders for at least 5000 years spices aromatic woods and barks resins plumes sea slugs shells and pearls all brought traders from distant markets among the most sought after was the bird of paradise their magnificent plumes bedecked the hats of fashion conscious women in europe and america provided regalia for the kings of nepal and decorated the headdresses of janissaries of the ottoman empire plumes from paradise tells the story of this interaction and of the economic political social and cultural consequence for the island s inhabitants it traces 400 years of economic and political history culminating in the plume boom of the early part of the 20th century when an unprecedented number of outsiders flocked to the island s coasts and hinterlands the story teems with the variety of people involved new guineans indonesians chinese europeans hunters traders natural historians and their collectors officials missionaries planters miners adventurers of every kind in the wings were the conservationists whose efforts

brought the slaughter of the plume boom to an end and ushered in an era of comparative isolation for the island that lasted until world war ii

it was on a sabbatical in england in the late seventies that suniti namjoshi discovered feminism or rather she discovered that other feminists existed and many among them shared her thoughts and doubts her questions and visions since then she has been writing fables poetry prose autobiography children s stories about power about inequality about oppression effectively using the power of language and the literary tradition to expose what she finds absurd and unacceptable this new collection brings together in one volume a huge range of namjoshi s writings starting with her classic collection feminist fables and coming right up to her latest work published by zubaan

aboriginal approaches to the naming of places across australia differ radically from the official introduced anglo australian system however many of these earlier names have been incorporated into contemporary nomenclature with considerable reinterpretations of their function and form recently state jurisdictions have encouraged the adoption of a greater number of indigenous names sometimes alongside the accepted anglo australian terms around sydney harbour for example in some cases the use of an introduced name such as gove has been contested by local indigenous people the 19 studies brought together in this book present an overview of current issues involving indigenous placenames across the whole of australia drawing on the disciplines of geography linguistics history and anthropology they include meticulous studies of historical records and perspectives stemming from contemporary indigenous communities the book includes a wealth of documentary information on some 400 specific placenames including those of sydney harbour the blue mountains canberra western victoria the lake eyre district the victoria river district and southwestern cape york peninsula

desired and in the process my books have taken readers to many many places i always say i ve started wars i ve burned down cities and i ve killed hundreds of thousands of people but only in my imagination from being attacked by lions to close encounters with deadly reef sharks from getting lost in the african bush without water to crawling the precarious tunnels of gold mines from marlin fishing with lee marvin to near death from crash landing a cessna airplane from brutal school days to redemption through writing and falling in love wilbur smith tells us the intimate stories of his life that have been the raw material for his fiction always candid sometimes hilarious and never less than thrillingly entertaining on leopard rockis testament to a writer whose life is as rich and eventful as his novels are compellingly unputdownable

in the 1970s the australian commonwealth government and three states victoria 1974 new south wales 1977 and south australia 1978 passed legislation to protect the built heritage within their jurisdictions the legislation was primarily a response to two factors a large number of public protests against the demolition of historic buildings in all australian states by the 1970s and the influence of the unesco world heritage convention which the whitlam government 1972 75 embraced enthusiastically the other states with governments that were more influenced by development interests were slow to follow the federal lead in this study sharon mosler examines heritage issues and conflicts in adelaide from enactment of the first south australian heritage act in 1978 to its successor in 1993 and also analyses issues leading from that period into the twenty first century state legislation introduced by the labor government of premier mike rann 2002 present has affected the built environment significantly since this book began the rann government has given the built heritage a low priority in its strategic plan compared to population growth while the adelaide city council has become more balanced in the past decade although the council too has focussed on increasing adelaides population the result has been more high rise buildings at the expense of heritage conservation and historic precincts

ten grids that changed the world the emergence and evolution of the most prominent visual structure in western culture emblematic of modernity the grid is the underlying form of everything from skyscrapers and office cubicles to paintings by mondrian and a piece of computer code and yet as hannah higgins makes clear in this engaging and evocative book the grid has a history that long predates modernity it is the most prominent visual structure in western culture in the grid book higgins examines the history of ten grids that changed the world the brick the tablet the gridiron city plan the map musical notation the ledger the screen moveable type the manufactured box and the net charting the evolution of each grid from the paleolithic brick of ancient mesopotamia through the virtual connections of the internet higgins demonstrates that once a grid is invented it may bend crumble or shatter but its organizing principle never disappears the appearance of each grid was a watershed event brick tablet and city gridiron made possible sturdy housing the standardization of language and urban development maps musical notation financial ledgers and moveable type promoted the organization of space music and time international trade and mass literacy the screen of perspective painting heralded the science of the modern period classical mechanics and the screen arts while the standardization of space made possible by the manufactured box suggested the purified box forms of industrial architecture and visual art the net the most ancient grid made its first appearance in stone age finland today the loose but clearly articulated networks of the world wide suggest that we are in the middle of an emergent grid that is reshaping the world as grids do in its image
